- **Language Workbooks**: Students are encouraged to purchase the consumable workbooks used in the following courses. These can be purchased at the back to school fair, on-line or in the office once school has started:
 - Spanish I, II or III \$20.00
 - French I \$8.00
- **PTSA membership** and **"Pass the Hat"** donation (Cash or check to "Leota PTSA")
- **Spirit Wear**
- **Photos for ID card/yearbook** are complimentary. All students are photographed for the school ID/ASB card and yearbook. Price packets are available if you wish to purchase photos (check to Dorian), but no purchase is necessary. Dorian order forms will be mailed to households and extras will be available at the Fair. Dress appropriately since this picture will be used for the yearbook, ASB card, and picture packet. (DRESS CODE applies) It is not necessary to have "ASB" printed on photo ID card.

SCHEDULE DISTRIBUTION AND LOCKER ASSIGNMENT

Student schedules will be distributed to the student or parents of the student only.

Schedule issues will be handled by Counseling, during the first two weeks of school.

Student locker and combination will be printed on the student schedule. Students are encouraged to keep their locker combinations confidential.

With the implementation of WEB (Where Everybody Belongs) at both incoming grade levels, the first days of school will look different for each grade level. **September 5th will only require attendance from 7th grade students and WEB Leaders. September 6th will only require attendance from 6th grade students and WEB Leaders. 8th graders (other than WEB Leaders) are asked not to attend school on the first two days.** These are for student-only orientation for 6th and 7th graders.

The two WEB First Day orientation and transition programs are designed to both welcome and support incoming 6th and 7th graders by assigning them an 8th grade WEB Leader as a mentor during their first year. This WEB Leader is a responsible older student who was hand selected from a large pool of applicants and has met the qualifications of being a good role model and positive leader on our campus.

WEB Days: Both 6th and 7th graders are asked to wear comfortable attire, as the day's activities will require movement. Please only bring what is listed here:

- **September 5th is for 7th graders and WEB only** (not an official day of school). HUB service will be provided for students. More information to follow from Transportation.
(Regular bus stops on September 7th)
 - ◊ All items will be provided (if you require a special diet, please bring your own lunch—pizza will be served)
- **September 6th is for 6th graders and WEB only** (official school day)
 - ◊ Regular school lunch will be served utilizing our cafeteria service (pizza will be served).
 - ◊ Students must use their lunch accounts to purchase lunch on this day.

- **Keep your schedule with you during the first day of school. Do NOT share this information with anybody else as your locker combination may be noted on the sheet of paper.**
- Bring a 3-ring binder, paper, pen, pencil, and lunch money.
- Be at your bus stop early on the first day. After August 24th, your route information may be found at www.nsd.org/nsdtransportation. You will not receive any other notification. Call Transportation directly with your questions at (425) 408-7900. (Please note no changes may be made regarding your stop during the initial two weeks of September while the Transportation Department sorts out its ridership).

LOCKERS

Every student will be issued a locker for his/her own use during the Back to School Fair on August 28th. Students unable to attend the Back to School Fair will be assigned a locker on the first day of school. If needed, Pride Time (home room) teachers will assign lockers on the first day of school.

Please discuss the following locker security and cleanliness rules with your child:

- Do not share your locker combination with anyone – not even your best friend.
- Be sure that your locker is completely closed and locked when you leave it.
- Do not keep valuable items in your locker; leave them at home.
- Keep lockers clean; nothing may be written on the inside or outside of lockers.
- Do not put stickers or other hard to remove items on the walls of your locker.

Everything must be removed from your locker at the end of the year. Lockers are for backpacks, books, student supplies, and coats. Students may not change lockers without permission from the assistant principal.

Lockers belong to Northshore School District and may be inspected at any time. Locker cleanouts are held periodically through the school year.

CLASS SCHEDULES

Schedules will be distributed at the Back to School Fair on Aug 28th.

If you are not able to pick it up then, log onto ParentVue or StudentVue to see your schedule.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST

Organization skills are important for success in junior high. Teachers recommend that students create one portable binder system that can be taken to each class as backpacks must be left in lockers. Some teachers will recommend additional supplies after school starts. The items below are required.

The binder system that works best is:

- One binder 2 ½ - 3 inches (needs to be thick enough to store everything)
- Pencil pouch with 3-hole punch (nylon suggested for durability)
- Planner will be provided when school starts. The planner has a 3 hole punch and will be kept in binder.
- 5 folders with pockets and 3-hole punched to be labeled for each subject area. (Math, English, Science, Social Studies and Health Fitness).
- 3 spiral notebooks, college ruled and 3-hole punched
- 1 - 2 composition books
- College ruled paper (some in folder, keep some at home or in locker)
- Graph paper (1/4 inch square), 3-hole punched
- Metric ruler protractor
- 4 function calculator for science (See below for recommendations)

The pencil pouch should always have:

- Pencils
- Pens (Black, Blue and Red)
- Highlighters (3 different colors)
- Post it notes (3x3 inch)
- 8 colored pencils
- 4 function calculator (see page 5 for recommendations)
- Small scissors

Optional for locker organization: Pencil box to store extra pencils, pens, Post it notes, etc.

BACKPACKS

Leota is a backpack-free zone. Students who bring backpacks or book bags to school must leave them in their lockers. Large items may be left in the office for safekeeping.

GRAPHING CALCULATOR

Starting with limited use in 8th grade and 7th Challenge Math, but extensive use in Algebra 1 and Geometry, students will be using the **TI-83 Plus or TI-84 graphing calculator**. If parents are planning to invest in a graphing calculator, we recommend the TI-83 Plus graphing calculator, as our curriculum includes technology tips for this specific model. In addition, this calculator is used in high school math classes and can be used in future college math classes. It is programmable, upgradeable, and not likely to become obsolete, which makes it useful for many years. The TI-84 is more expensive, but does the same thing as the TI- 83 Plus. While it is not required for students to have a graphing calculator (except for students in Algebra 1 and Algebra II/Trigonometry who will need to have one), it is advisable for students to have access to one. There are classroom sets of graphing calculators available for students to use during class time and after school. Having a calculator at home will allow the student to finish class work outside of class.

HEALTH AND FITNESS

All Leota students are expected to appropriately “dress-down” for H/F; the Health & Fitness department has therefore established a basic dress code of “grays.” The gray uniforms were chosen for many reasons, including (but in no way limited to) trying to choose a common and readily available color, one that is easier to keep clean (easier than white), and one that is typically much less expensive.

Leota uniforms are available for purchase online at www.risan.com, click on "Leota" and you'll see the items available for purchase or in person at Risan Athletics. Risan is not endorsed by NSD, they merely offer the uniforms and deliver them to H&F in the first week of school. Black hoodies/pants with logo are also available at Risan and may be worn for H&F in cold weather. **Uniform purchase is not mandatory, students may wear logo-free gray t-shirts, shorts, and sweats.**

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Due to our concern for students and staff of the Leota Middle School learning community, we strive to foster an environment that is safe, healthy, conducive to teaching and learning, and promotes the dignity of all students. Student dress should be compatible with an educational setting—rather than an off-campus social setting. Students may express individuality in their dress and grooming as long as their appearance does not cause or have the potential to cause a disruption to the educational process for themselves, other students, or staff.

In an effort to maintain a safe and academic focus we ask that students attending Leota Middle School adhere to the following guidelines:

Please do not wear clothing or display emblems or accessories that:

- Demean or degrade individuals or groups of people;
- Display violent or illegal activity (e.g., weapons; alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use);
- Exhibit sexual innuendoes, blatant sexual messages, vulgarity, and/or profanity;
- Show affiliation with gangs, including bandanas, and otherwise determined by local law enforcement.

The shaded portion of this figure represents the front and back views. These parts of the body must be covered in all positions (sitting, standing, bending, reaching) while attending school.



Head: For safety reasons, hoods and sunglasses are not permitted at school.

Torso: Clothing must have straps, cover stomachs, backs, chests, and undergarments

Legs: Shorts, skirts, dresses must be at or below your fingertips when your arms are relaxed at your side. Undergarments must be covered.

Feet: For safety reasons, footwear must be worn at all times and be appropriate to the activity.

The Leota administration and staff appreciate the cooperation of students and parents in reviewing the students' dress to meet established guidelines. If a student's dress or appearance is such that it constitutes a threat to the health or safety of others, is not suitable to the norms of an educational setting, or otherwise violates this dress code, the principal or the principal's designee may require the student to change his or her dress. A second or repeated violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action in accordance with school policy and procedures.

LET PayPAMS HELP MANAGE CAFETERIA ACCOUNTS

The Parent Account Management System (PAMS) allows for credit card payments of school meals via the Internet or telephone. Parents can also use PayPAMS to schedule automatic payments based on account balance, to review cafeteria purchases online, and to receive email notification of account balances. You must set up an account using one of the approved credit cards to check account balances or payment history.

The PayPAMS program has been enhanced and now accepts Mastercard, Discover and Visa. PayPAMS will charge \$1.95 per payment transaction for a processing fee. Fees are not charged when a family pays by cash or check (made payable to the Northshore School District) at school. The student ID number should be included with all payments. Parents and guardians are invited to the Leota Middle School Curriculum Night on Wednesday, September 13th at 6:30 pm. The event will begin in the gym. You will then be dismissed to your student's first period class and follow your student's daily schedule, proceeding from class to class. You will have an opportunity to meet individual teachers and learn about your student's classes. Teachers will speak briefly about curriculum and answer questions. This will be a great way to experience your child's daily routine. The school's AIDS curriculum will also be available for review. On the day of Curriculum Night, students will bring home a copy of their schedule and a school map.

PTSA's Pass the Hat Fundraiser will be held at the beginning of the evening in the gym and in "Pride" class. It is our primary, quick and easy fundraiser where 100% of your donation will go toward our PTSA budget. ASB CARDS

To help support our Associated Student Body programs, we strongly encourage students to purchase an ASB card. Students participating in Leota sports, music, after-school activities and clubs, or who have been elected as ASB officers must purchase an ASB card.

ASB revenue is used toward athletics, assemblies, dances, uniforms, Lion's Day, and other special activities and equipment. As a benefit, students receive discounts on dances and other events throughout the year. The cost of an ASB card is \$30; cards can be purchased at the Back to School Fair on August 28th and in the Main Office during lunch. Checks for ASB cards should be made payable to Leota Middle School.

ASB MAGAZINE AND COOKIE DOUGH SALE

On September 22nd the Leota ASB kicks off our annual Magazine & Cookie Dough Sale Fundraiser. This is the only ASB fundraiser of the year. Please begin thinking about the magazines you would like to renew or any new titles you would like to order, plus marking items off your holiday gift-giving list. See the wish list for the school library on page 14. Not only will you be supporting your child's school, but you will also be able to purchase magazines at a better price.

We will honor all manufacturer coupons and discounts. The option to purchase magazines online using a credit card is available. This option makes selling to relatives out of the area much easier. Cookie dough, some small gifts and cards will also be available for purchase. Look for these items in the students' magazine/dough catalogs. Leota uses the magazine and cookie dough sale as a fundraiser because it's the most effective way to raise money in the least amount of time. Leota's ASB receives 40-45% of the sales, which are used to support student activities, athletic equipment, drama, Lions Day, assemblies, dances, clubs, etc. Turn-in days are 9/28 and 10/5. ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

State law and common sense tell us that it is important for schools to monitor the attendance of students very carefully. It is a challenge to follow the absences, late arrivals, and early dismissals of nearly 900 students. Students and parents can make the job easier by being aware of the rules and making sure they follow them. The Attendance Office has developed the following policies to safeguard your child:

- All students must check in at the Attendance Office when departing from and returning to campus!
- Students returning from an absence must have the absence excused by a parent or guardian. This can be done by telephone (408-6510 or 408-6518) or with a written note. The Attendance Office must receive a note or phone call before the student reports for class.
- Students arriving late for school must bring a note to the Attendance Office before going to class.
- Teachers will automatically issue infractions to students who arrive late without a pass.
- Students who need to leave school early should bring a note to the Attendance Office before school starts. Students will be asked to report to the Attendance Office at dismissal time. Parents need to come to the Attendance Office to sign them out.

By adhering to these attendance policies you help to ensure the safety of your child and make the job of the Attendance Office much easier. Call us at 408-6510 if you have any questions. Thank You.

WEB LEADERS

Students and staff at Leota are a part of nationally recognized program called WEB. This program is an orientation and year-long transition program that focuses on "Students Helping Students Succeed". Students previously selected as WEB Leaders will be attending training on August 23 and 24th from 8am to 1pm in the Gym.

September 5th will be for 7th grade students, WEB leaders and WEB Assistance team members. The day will begin when students meet in the gym at 8:25 am for a high-energy orientation assembly. Next, 7th graders will be placed into groups of 8-12 and be introduced to their WEB leaders where they will receive their class schedules. Pizza lunch will be provided (if you have specific dietary needs, please bring your own lunch).*

September 6th will be for 6th grade students, WEB leaders and WEB Assistance team members. The day will begin when students meet in the gym at 8:25 am for a high-energy orientation assembly. Next, 6th graders will be placed into groups of 8-12 and be introduced to their WEB leaders where they will receive their class schedules. Lunch will be available for purchase.*

Our hope is that the transition from elementary school to junior high will be smooth and that the year begins with a positive and fun day!

***Reminder:** Please do NOT bring school supplies on this day.

LEOTA TECHNOLOGY

The Northshore School District maintains a Responsible Use Procedure (RUP) to guide the use of technology throughout the district, summarized below. **NSD's Responsible Use Procedure is in place to foster the idea of digital citizenship. A digital citizen is one who:**

- Understands human, cultural and social issues related to technology and practices legal and ethical behavior
- Advocates and practices safe, legal and responsible use of information and technology
- Exhibits a positive attitude toward using technology that supports collaboration, learning and productivity
- Demonstrates personal responsibility for lifelong learning
- Exhibits leadership for digital citizenship
- Reports inappropriate use of technology
- Uses appropriate passwords and practices responsible password management
- Refrains from posting personal information (or other people's personal information)
- Uses technology at school for educational purposes only
- All users of district technology will observe 'Fair Use' and 'Educational Use' copyright laws



Students who fail to comply with the responsibilities outlined in the RUP may be subject to disciplinary action defined at the building level as well as suffer a loss of technology-related privileges.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Expectations

- Electronic devices (cell phones, iPods, mp3 players, cameras, headphones, games, etc.) must not be seen or heard anywhere on campus during school hours except at teacher/staff discretion for educational purposes only.
- Electronic devices cannot be used for pictures or audio/video recording on campus at any time without teacher approval.
- Texting and/or messaging is NOT permitted at anytime during the school day.
- Leota is not liable for theft or damage of electronic devices.

Please do not call, text and/or message your student directly during school hours as discipline could result.

If a student needs to contact a parent/guardian during school, they are welcome to use the student phone in the Attendance Office.

CONSEQUENCES:

1st Offense: Electronic device may be returned to student in the office after school.

2nd Offense: Electronic device may be returned to the student in the office and/or an **infraction** issued.

3rd Offense: Electronic device may be returned to the parent in the office and/or a **detention** issued.

Chronic offenses could result in additional progressive discipline per school discipline policy.

All electronics sent to the office will be stored in a locked drawer until retrieved.

BYOD NETWORK (Bring Your Own Device)

Leota now has the district BYOD wireless network available to students. This does NOT mean that students are required to bring their own device to school.

- Students are allowed to connect their personal device to this network for educational purposes only with the permission of their classroom teacher.
- Students will always have technology provided for them if it is required for classroom use.
- All Leota rules regarding technology use must still be followed.
- Texting is not allowed during the school day.
- Electronic devices cannot be used for pictures or audio/video recording on campus at any time without teacher approval.



We are excited for the opportunity this new network presents, but this does not replace technology offered to students for their use at Leota.

INTERNET ACCESS

Internet access is available to all students at Leota Middle School. Leota Middle School's staff encourages parents to review the "Internet Code of Conduct" with their children. A copy of this document is also included in the Statement of Rights & Responsibilities Concerning Pupil Conduct, which every student receives at the beginning of each school year. Students will be expected to follow the District's "Acceptable Use Procedures" and the "Code of Conduct" while using the Internet and other Northshore School District technology. The complete Northshore School District Network Policy/Procedure document may be reviewed in the Main Office.

Parents not wanting their students to access the Internet must return the completed District Technology Opt-Out Form as described below. Please discuss your decision with your child. It is your child's responsibility to not use the Internet if that is your decision for him/her. You may change your student's access at any time by requesting the appropriate form from the Main Office at 408-6500. Please be advised that most teachers use a variety of technology for assignments and by restricting use at school it will be the student's responsibility to complete these assignments.

DISTRICT TECHNOLOGY OPT-OUT

We live in a global and digital world -- a world changed by technology and new ideas about how we communicate with one another and exchange information. As a result, students must develop the research, information fluency, and technology skills that will allow them to be successful, safe and ethical in this digital world. For this reason, students are provided computer access privileges at school, as well as access to the Internet, email, digital communication and collaboration tools, online learning spaces, and electronic educational resources. These resources, tools, and equipment are essential to teaching and learning. The guidelines for responsible use of these tools are outlined in School Board Procedure 2022P, which can be found here: <https://goo.gl/mPQ1qD>



Given all of these factors, Parents or guardians still do have the right to terminate their student's access to electronic tools and resources by signing the District Technology Opt-Out form, which can be found at <http://www.nsd.org/techoptout>. If you do not want your student to use District technology resources, please be aware that your decision to eliminate access to these tools may significantly affect your student's ability to work collaboratively with his or her peers on class assignments and project, and may impact the development of skills necessary to live and work in this increasingly digital world.

Only complete the form if you choose for your student NOT to use District Technology. Return the signed form to your school and schedule an appointment to discuss this with your Principal or Designated School Administrator. After meeting with your Administrator, the Opt-Out request will remain in effect for one school year, and expires at the end of this school year. To keep this Opt-Out in effect, you must complete a new form every school year.

If no documentation is on file, it will be assumed that permission has been granted for access to the Internet, GoogleApps for Education, Online Curriculum services, and other online applications and services that have been selected for use by the District, your child's school, or your child's teacher.

Questions about the Opt-Out request can be directed to your school's Principal.

Health Room

Our Registered Nurse, Debbie Park, serves our building full time. Her duties are diverse, from administering first aid and necessary medication to monitoring the general health

and well-being of our students. Our health room is used for emergency care and for ill students awaiting pick-up.

Space and personnel are not available to accommodate extended care or supervision. We require that you or an emergency contact will pick up your sick child within the hour that you are called.

Please keep the nurse informed of any health concerns or changes in your child's health, including new or resolved medical or mental health diagnosis, medication changes and immunization updates.

For your child's safety it is very important to keep your home, cell, work, and emergency contact telephone numbers current.

If you change jobs or cell phone numbers, please give us your new number immediately. This will assist us getting in touch with you when it is an emergency.

Children learn best when they are healthy. If you think your child is getting sick, **please keep him/her home**. This helps keep other children from getting sick and gives your child the rest he/she needs to get well quickly.

When Should I Keep my Child Home from School?

A temperature, taken orally, that is 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, is considered a fever. Children should be fever-free, without fever reducing medication, for at least 24 hours before sending them to school.

Anytime a child vomits or has diarrhea, he/she needs to be isolated from other children for 24 hours. If your child vomits or has diarrhea in the night, keep him/her home from school the following day.

Any rash of unknown cause should be considered contagious. Please have your child examined by a healthcare provider to determine the cause and communicability of the rash before sending him/her to school. The child may not return to school unless there is a letter from the medical professional stating that the rash is not communicable in nature, or unless the rash is no longer present.

24 hours after administration of the first dose of an antibiotic or as directed by the health care provider.

Accidents

If a child is injured at school, he/she will be given emergency first-aid treatment by the nurse, principal, school secretary, or a first aid-trained health room assistant. The parents will be called immediately in the event of a serious injury. If you are not at home or work, the person listed as the "First Emergency" contact will be called. If no one is available to come for the child, we will use our best judgment on whether to keep the child in the nurse's office or call 911 for medical assistance.

Children with Life-Threatening Conditions

In order to provide a safe learning environment, the state of Washington passed a law that requires students with life-threatening conditions to have medical orders and a nursing care plan in place BEFORE the first day of school attendance. (Chapter 101, Laws of 2002, amending Chapter 28A.210 RCW)

The law defines life-threatening condition as “a health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment order and a nursing plan are not in place.” Children with life-threatening conditions such as diabetes, severe bee sting or food allergies, severe asthma, severe seizures, etc., are required to have a medication or treatment order in place before they start school.

“Medication or treatment order” means the authority a registered nurse obtains under RCW 18.79.260(2). This is covered when the child’s licensed health care provider completes the Authorization for Medication form or treatment order for medical services to be performed at the school.

If a medication or treatment order is not provided, the principal of the school is required to exclude the child until such an order is provided. This requirement applies to students with life-threatening conditions who are new to the district, and students who are already attending the school.

If your child has a life-threatening health condition requiring medical services at school, or if you have questions about a medical condition, please notify the school nurse right away.

Students with a life-threatening condition qualify for a 504 Accommodation/Emergency Care Plan.

Please set up a meeting with the school nurse in order to have all necessary forms and medications in place prior to starting school.

Health Screening

Health screening for hearing and vision is done each Fall in grades K-3, 5th and 7th grade. Other students may be screened for hearing or vision upon referral by the teacher or parent. The vision screening does not identify all vision problems and is not intended as a substitute for periodic eye examinations by a healthcare provider. A referral letter will be sent home when a student’s hearing and/or vision screening results do not meet the expectations for their age.

Immunization

For the protection of your child, the Washington State immunization law states that every child attending public or private school **must show proof of compliance with the law before the student’s first day of attendance. Any student not meeting this requirement will be excluded.** Bothell Health Point (425-486-0658) accepts medical coupons and has a sliding fee scale. If you need assistance in acquiring these immunizations, please contact the school nurse.

Medications at School

If your student will be taking ANY medication at school, you must confer with the school nurse.

The Northshore School District recommends that medication be taken at home whenever possible. We recognize, however, that in some cases it is essential that medication be administered during the school day. For the protection of all the students and to comply with Washington state law, the district has a policy and procedures in place for the handling of ALL medications in the schools.

Please do not put any kind of medicine, including aspirin, vitamins, and cough drops in your child's lunch box, backpack or pockets. Unidentified medicine can **never** be given at school. Students who require use of a narcotic for pain control should be kept home.

School Staff Administered - The following conditions must be met:

- All medications, whether over-the-counter or prescription, need a current Northshore Medication Authorization Form signed by the student's physician/dentist **and** parent/guardian.
- Medication must be delivered to school in a properly labeled prescription or original over-the-counter container.
The student's name must be on the label with proper identification of the drug, dosage, and directions for administration.
 - A quantity sufficient for one month **only** can be sent to school.
 - The medication order is effective for the **current** school year only.
 - If changes in the medication order occur, the parent is responsible for notifying the school and providing verification from the physician/dentist.

Field Trips: For students on daily medication, an Authorization for Medication must be completed and on file with the nurse. Request an extra labeled container from your pharmacy for use on field trips.

Student Self-Administered Medication - The following conditions must be met:

In appropriate cases and with the knowledge of the school nurse, the parent/guardian can delegate the responsibility for self-administration of medication to the student. In doing so, the parent releases the school district from any obligation to monitor the student and assumes full responsibility for the student's use of the medication.

Self-Administration does not apply to controlled substances, e.g. codeine, vicodin

The student may only carry a one-day supply (1 - 2 doses) of the medication.

The medication must be in the original container.

The student must have written permission to self-medicate signed by the parent/guardian.

Medication to be self-administered for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days, whether over-the-counter or prescription, requires a current Northshore Medication Authorization Form signed by the student's physician/dentist and parent/guardian stating that the student may self-medicate. The student must also demonstrate his/her ability to the School Nurse to correctly evaluate his/her symptoms and use the medication appropriately.

Asthma and Anaphylaxis medications:

When a parent requests that his/her student be allowed to self-administer medication for asthma and/or anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction), an Authorization for Medication must be filled out and signed by the Health Care Provider **and** parent/guardian. The permission form must contain a treatment plan for what to do in case of an emergency. The Health Care Provider must also provide training for the student to recognize symptoms and the correct use of medications. Additionally, the student must demonstrate his/her ability to correctly evaluate his/her symptoms and use of medications to the school nurse including how to access help when needed. (RCW 28A.210.370 and School District Policy 3419)

ONLINE SPORTS REGISTRATION

According to WIAA, NSD and Leota Middle School policy, every athlete must meet the following requirements for athletic eligibility in order to participate in extra-curricular sports.

To participate, all forms must be completed online at:

www.familyID.com/organizations/leota-middle-school. Please register your student only once, scanning their current physical into the registration at the same time. If a physical is needed, NSD forms are available on the site. Please do not submit your physician's forms; it may not include the criteria needed for eligibility. Check the boxes of all sports your student may be interested in playing. Do not register your student multiple times throughout the year, as it creates inaccurate reports and rosters. All students must have completed registration and a current physical (within 2 years) to participate in practices. A complete registration does not require fees be paid.

For assistance with registration or uploading of physical, see "help" section at www.familyID.com.

FEES: Participation fee is \$100 (\$200 max /year), payable beginning the second week of tryout/cuts and before first game/ match, payable by check/cash in the main office or online at <https://schoolsales.nsd.org>. ASB Card is \$30 per year, due before first game/ match.

ACADEMIC ELEGIBILITY:

- Passing 5 classes in a 6 period class schedule in the previous semester (WIAA 18.7.0)
 - Cumulative 2.0 GPA in the previous semester (Northshore School District)
- Continued requirement of currently passing 5 of 6 classes within the season (WIAA 19.7.3)

TRANSPORTATION: is provided one-way only to athletic matches. Students need transportation from "away" events to their home. Activity buses are available for students to ride home from Leota at 4:40 pm every day except Wednesday. There are no after-school practices or games on Early Release Wednesdays. INSURANCE AVAILABLE

Northshore School District does not maintain accident/medical insurance coverage for students. What this means is, if a child gets hurt during school activities, the parent is responsible for any medical bills. Therefore, this insurance opportunity may be an affordable, useful alternative for parents who may not otherwise have accident and/or medical coverage, or who want to enhance the coverage they already have. Forms are available in the counseling office at Leota.
